

Dear Rev. Nicholas R. Desmond,

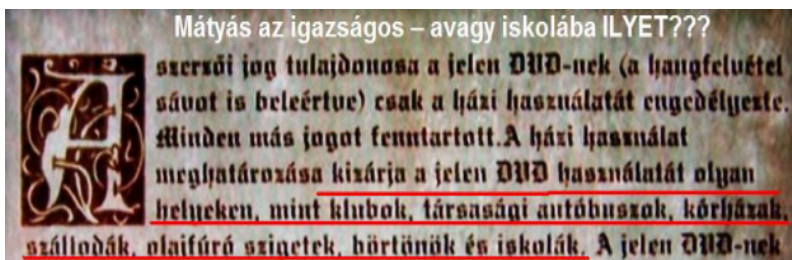
